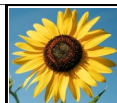

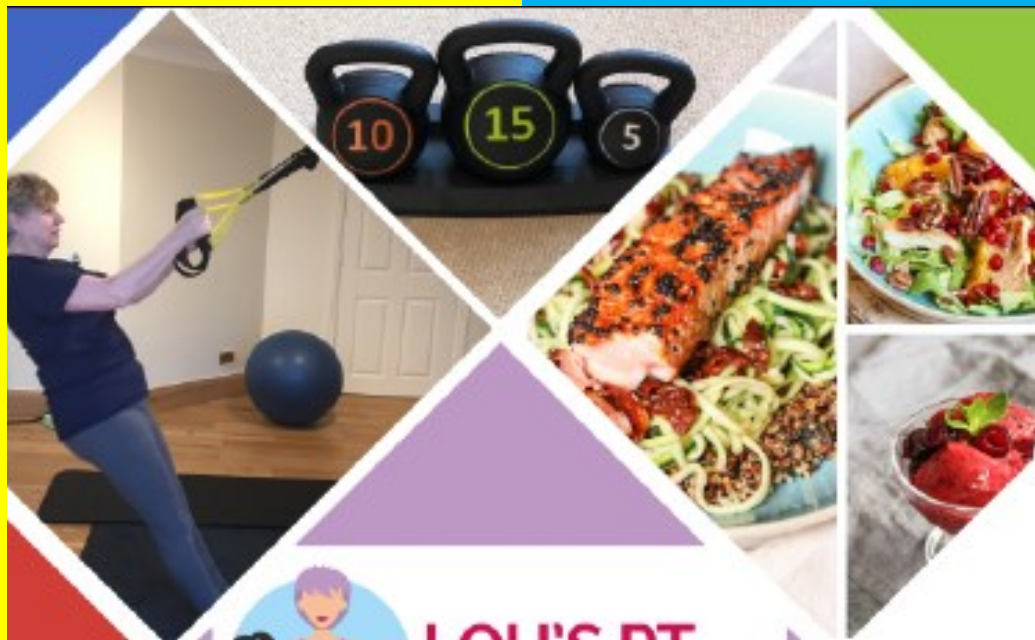

WINTER OF CONTENT!

The front page of the winter edition of the Newsletter got folks talking, "where is this house that Mrs Brooks lives in?" It didn't help that a family called Brooks lived in The Causeway; surely those houses were built in the 1950's, well 1953 to be precise; they must have had electricity? They are the same family, Mrs Brooks son, Gordon (Bud) raised his family in number 4. The house which Mrs Brooks lived in for almost 60 years is owned by Maxine and Malcolm Johnson; Maxine's parents had bought the house with the Brook's as sitting tenants in 1963 in order that her father had right of way to the property next door, where the family moved in 1965. When Mrs Brooks died in June 1987, Maxine and Malcolm who had been living in Oadby acquired the house and set about restoring what had been a farm house. It turned out to be a massive undertaking



when they realised that this was no ordinary building, but box framed; this structure is not unlike cruck framed, the beams of which, reach down to the ground. It did not help that there were many rotten floor beams, no internal foundations and much wattle and daub! Even the internal walls were not knitted together in some places. The architect dated the house to early 1500's making it the oldest house in the village. It was considered that the original ground floor room was even older. Connecting electricity was a joke, we could only put on the form that it was a new house! I am sure most folks would have guessed where it was, the clue is in the name, Brook House! We never changed it. On a final note, Maxine grew up in number 4 The Causeway! The family moved in on Christmas Eve 1953 when she was five months old. MJ

Langton Community Hall....Looking forward to 2022



The new year is well underway and the Langton Community Hall is ready to welcome old and new users!

As we look back over the last two years, the pandemic provided both challenges and opportunities for the trustees of the hall:

- We were able to support Church Langton Primary School (with the help of the Hanbury Charity) in continuing to provide education and vital breakfast and after school care. Headteacher, Steve Roddy said "Access to the Community Hall made a significant difference when we were planning to reopen following Covid lockdown. It allowed for more classes to attend than our site would have allowed."
- We took the opportunity to upgrade the outside lighting, improve the heating, install a new projector and speakers and ensure WiFi was available in all rooms.

Most of our regular users are now back at the hall running classes which include: Tae Kwon Do, Keep Fit, Yoga, Langton Art Club and Table Tennis. There are opportunities for all ages from pre-school children to older members of the community. Also, several local music groups use the hall regularly to practise and rehearse.

There are still some regular sessions available to book and also opportunities for one off hire for parties, so if you are interested in hiring the hall please contact us. There are 3 different sized rooms available and you can see these on our website <https://langtoncommunityhall.org/>. The largest room has a badminton court marked out and is also suitable for hosting large parties.

The hall was recently hired for an anniversary party (picture below) and the hosts described it as "A fantastic venue for our special anniversary".

We have maintained the enhanced cleaning arrangements brought in during the pandemic and you can be assured that providing a clean and safe space is a priority.

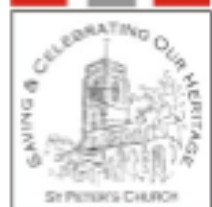

Village Hall

Harborough District Council agreed, on 26 January 2022, to allocate the funding from its Community Fund which, this year, was looking for projects which will improve spaces and places, as well as support young people aged 11+ with diversionary activities or around anxiety, self-image, or childhood inactivity.

Those projects which have successfully applied for funding include:

Glooston Village Hall – £2,306 for a village hall update project, with paved area at the back, shed and better lighting

Remembering Gary Nottingham



Gary was a popular resident in Church Langton for more than 30 years- around the village, in the pub or at local events. In 2020 he became unwell and was diagnosed with cancer. Following difficult but successful treatment in early 2021, he was recovering. But sadly in November he became unwell again, and then unexpectedly suffered a fatal heart attack.

His funeral took place on December 20th at St Peter's Church, where he lays at rest.

Over 100 people were in attendance at what has been described as a beautiful and fitting service. My thanks go to all those there, and also those who were not able to attend, either through other commitments, or because they were isolating.

It was led by Rev. Martin Hathaway and Lay incumbent Maxine Johnson, with a wonderful choir led by Simon Ainge, organist. The funeral was managed expertly by Chris Stamp of J. Stamp and sons.

Many local people provided flowers and decorated the church, and many others provided food and drink at the wake at The Community Hall.

It is a great testament to the community spirit of these people, and love for Gary that this was made possible. I have been overwhelmed with cards, and so I wish to thank everyone who has written, or phoned or called on me with offers of support...it really has helped.

Macmillan Cancer Care benefitted by the fantastic sum of almost £300, raised by people's generosity.

It is clear that Gary will be greatly missed in and around Church Langton, but hopefully memories of him will live on.

News from St. Peter's



Christmas seems a long time ago now, back then, we were still having to be very careful, wearing face masks, signing in, hand sanitizing, sitting apart, not partaking of a physical show of the Peace by shaking hands etc and isolating if positive for Covid . This is looking like a thing of the past, 'Praise the Lord' as the nation gets back to a new normality, will things ever be the same again we ask? Some things will change; I just wonder if we will ever go back to the 'shared' Communion cup of pre Covid times whereby all Communicants drank from the same silver cup. I am sure future generations will think, "how disgusting" as the new normality settles down to become normal! There will be far more subtle changes going forward than a shared cup in Church, maybe you too, will notice how some things will be changed or the transition will be just a natural progression that is hardly noticeable! At least we, in St. Peter's can return to some of our Services that have been curtailed these last two years. We will be holding our Ash Wednesday Service to mark the beginning of Lent. It is a solemn reminder of human mortality and the need for reconciliation with God and marks the beginning of the penitential Lenten season. Christians use this observance of Lent to fast and lose weight! Historically, a house will rid it's self of treats, which is why we have Shrove Tuesday or Pancake day the day before, to rid the house of eggs and other tasty foods; modern times, it may well be chocolate! During the period of Lent, Bible study is held, usually in someone's home, usually mine for Church Langton, to focus on the journey of Christ to the cross. Then Maundy Thursday, the evening before Good Friday as Christian

observe the last supper before the Crucifixion. A very moving Service which again will be held at St. Peter's. After Easter, there are several fund raising projects to look out for. Proceeds from Open Gardens to be held in May, will be to Charities to be confirmed and in part to St. Peter's. The concert of Messiah on 14th May will certainly be a memorable occasion. It is hoped that there will be a musical concert once a month on a Sunday afternoon, details to follow in the next edition. MJ

Welcome to Our New Rural Dean

Following Reverend Alison Booker's promotion to Archdeacon of Oakham and her departure to the Diocese of Peterborough we welcome our new Rural Dean.

Dear friends,

With everything happening in our world, many of us ask whether another way to live might be possible. We ask how we might live well, as part of creation, with justice and compassion and creativity. We ask if there is anything or anyone in which we can put our trust and the last couple of years has caused many to reconsider the values and stories they live by.

I have recently taken up three new roles in Launde Deanery which I hope will help us to seek the answers to some of these questions. In January I became Area Dean alongside Revd. Alan Humphrey (based at Launde Abbey) which is a support role for parish churches and their leaders. In February I also become the Growing Faith Enabler for the Deanery and Associate Priest.

The Growing Faith role is focused on facilitating the partnership between Schools, Households and Churches in enabling the discovery and growth of faith in the whole of life for everyone. This role seeks to draw all three contexts together as we seek to navigate our changing world and discover the *way* forward. As part of this, I will also be serving as a Priest in the Deanery and supporting our local parishes as they also seek to love their communities and grow in faith.

I am married to Emma and we have three children (Amber 15, Ethan 11 and Hugo 3). Both Amber and Ethan have been part of the school community at Church Langton, Ethan being in Year 6 and we hope Hugo will start there in September. At the moment we live in Gartree, but will move to the vicarage in Church Langton soon after Easter. I am a keen photographer (traditional black and white film being my passion) and I love a good walk and fresh coffee. I look forward to meeting you, exploring life's questions with you and discovering the way of faith with you soon.

Celebrating Ten Years of Cycling Art

Maxine Dodd – Spring show

Canon Gallery, Oundle, 23rd – 29th April 2022

This year, Church Langton artist, Maxine Dodd celebrates ten years of drawing and painting the Tour de France and is delighted to show some of her favourite pictures inspired by the great race at the Canon Gallery in Oundle, in April.

Maxine started this body of work in the summer of 2012, drawing and painting the live action from the race as it unfolded every day. She launched her blog 'Racing Lines' to publish these drawings and paintings, which she still uses as the main platform for her work, which has developed over the years to include rugby, football and scenes from daily life – some of which will also be on display.

Her images are colourful and expressive, as she captures the movement and drama of the sport, along with the flags, banners and crowds of fans that line the route along the way.

She uses watercolour, pen and ink along with pastel, gouache and acrylic to create images evoking the styles of her favourite French artists, Matisse and Dufy.

All the paintings will be for sale and Maxine will be at the gallery every day to meet and talk about her work. She will bring her sketchbooks and materials to show how the pictures are made.

The Canon Gallery is a great venue for this celebratory show, as Oundle is a favourite pit-stop for many cyclists and cycle groups locally - with the popular cafe 'Beans' across the road, where many riders take a rest and refreshment. If you're riding out that way, why not stop off and call in?

Neighbourhood Plan Review The 6 week Regulation 16 consultation ended on 2nd March. Thank you to those who have responded and to the Keep Our Open Space Open residents group who aided those who wanted to respond to Policy ENV1 (Thorpe Path Open Space). The Plan will now go forward to the Examiner who will decide on the new policies being put forward in the Plan. We expect to learn of their decision and comments in October.

Thorpe Path (Diocesan Field)

A meeting was called by the Leicester Diocesan Board of Education on 10th February. The meeting, which was attended by 3 members of the the LDBE via Zoom was chaired by Phil King and also attended by members of the Parish Council, Neil O'Brien (MP), Matt Bills (HDC Open Spaces officer), members of the 'KOOSO' residents group and a good turn out of local people.

The LDBE called the meeting to offer the field for sale solely to the village for £525,000. This is not an independent valuation but one made by their land agent Grangers. East Langton Parish Council has been asked to consider the offer and respond to the LDBE.

In the meantime the Parish Council's Neighbourhood Plan Review is seeking Local Green Space designation (the highest protection against development).

Developers are now on site. They are starting with preparing hard standing for the machinery and erecting temporary security fencing. Lorries will be directed away from the village. Western Power will then remove some of the overhead power lines placing them underground.
